# YOUR LESSONS

We are happy to assist with any queries, however, IELS reserves the right to expel students for unacceptable behaviour. If you are expelled, you will not be refunded for the remainder of your course or accommodation. The cost of the return flight will be at your own expense.





The minimum attendance rate is 80%.



Do not write in your book on the 1st two days in case you need to change level.



Your lessons are compulsory and you are expected to arrive on time.



You will be given a certificate with your level & attendance rate on the last day of your stay.



Lessons are based on a combination of book-based tasks and supplementary materials.



Please fill in the welcome and last day questionnaires to help us improve!



If you need to extend your Visa, please inform the Welfare Desk.



The minimum attendance rate to have the Visa is 75%. If the attendance is lower, student risks to get expelled and their Visa to be revoked. IELS is legally required to Unit inform Visa of unauthorised missed days from school. even if attendance doesn't drop below 75%



# COUNTRIES NOT EXEMPT FROM VISA

Apply for a visa extension at least 21 days before your 90 days as tourist expires. From the moment you are submitting your application to Visa Unit you must have a minimum of 8 weeks of course left.



Students are allowed to take up to 4 weeks of holiday break every 24 weeks. Holiday breaks need to be booked before the Visa application.



A doctor's certificate is required for sick days otherwise your attendance will be affected.

You must be at least 17 to buy alcohol and 18 to buy tobacco.

Abortion is illegal in Malta. Contraception is available from pharmacies. It's illegal to have sex with anyone under 18.

The use, possession, purchase or sale of any drug is illegal.



The Welfare Desk is situated on the ground floor and is open from 08.30 to 17.00 Monday to Friday.

They are ready to help with visas, accommodation, and general problems.



If you cannot come to your lesson because you are sick, you must advise Welfare Team the same day. You must bring a medical certificate the day when you return to school.



Ask at Reception about pharmacies in the area.

Pharmacies close on Sundays & public holidays, but one is open in each district on a rota. The airport pharmacy is open every day.

Depending on your country of residence you might be entitled to free medical assistance. For more information please visit www.ehealth.gov.mt or ask at reception.

## **Safety Tips**

- Exercise caution when using any ATM
- Do not carry an opened glass container of alcohol on the street, or walk in swim wear as it is forbidden by Maltese law

### **Emergencies**

If you have an emergency outside of school hours and need help, you can call the welfare team on (+356) 9942 9617.

For any emergencies requiring an ambulance, the fire brigade or the police, you should dial 112 and then advise IELS staff immediately.



You must obey the laws of this country. Some laws are the same as in your country but some are not.

If you break the law the Police may arrest you, and you may be sent home at your own expense.

If you are arrested please contact your embassy and lawyer.

Do not litter.





Banks are usually open until the early afternoons from Monday to Friday and until midday Saturday.



The country's official languages are Maltese and English, but Italian is also widely spoken.



The closest ATM machine to IELS is 5 minutes away, at the Tigne Shopping find Complex.



Malta's currency is the Euro (€). You can change money at many banks or exchange bureaus and all over the islands.



Plugs are three pin (UK style) and 230V. You can adaptors very easily.



We recommend bottled mineral water although tap water is safe to drink



Ask the Leisure Desk if you need assistance getting a Maltese SIM



To call a Maltese number, dial +356 first. To call home from a Maltese phone, first dial your country code.


### **Shopping in Malta**

With a large number of historic buildings, Malta's capital city is a World Heritage Site. In 2018, Valletta was also the European Capital of Culture.





#### **ACCOMMODATION**




Staying at an IELS accommodation is a great way to make friends and practise your English!
